shoe. 2. Select shoe style for the occasion for which, they will be worn. High fashion styles such as gold, sequine, brocade, satin, silk, jeweled and glitter shoes are to be worn only with after five fashions, such as cock-tail parties, late dinner

and dance. For work, sport and mid-day fashions, stay with kids, lizard, aligator, snake skin, and suede. 3. Go wild with colors



4. Fashions dictate the heel height, but remem-ber to choose the heel height that you are most comfortable wearing.

Select the heel width that is comfortable for walking. I am amazed at the number of women that I see daily tottering off balance along the streets in very high heels.

A very important factor in foot comfort is the care of the feet. Cut toe nails straight across to prevent in - growing nails. Use lotion daily after bath to help keep feet as soft as your hands.
