SOUTHERN SHIPBUILDER INTEGRATES TRAINING

INGALLS SHIPBUILDING CORP., Pascagoula, Miss., first shipbuilding company in the Nation to conduct a full-scale training program through the Manpower Development and Training Act, has disclosed that it is conducting its training classes on a racially intergrated basis. Negro and white trainees attend all classes and receive all instruction together.

Three full-time training programs are designed to teach the skilled and technical arts of shipbuilding to 90 young men from Jackson County and surrounding areas--all new to the shipbuilding industry.

Following completion of the pre-employment training program graduates will be eligible for employment in various job classifications within the hull division.

STUDENTS SELECTED for these programs must be between the ages of 18 to 35, high school graduate or equivalent, have the ability to pass standardized aptitude tests for "shipfitters," be physically

fit for construction work and must be screened by the Mississippi State Employment Service and referred to Ingalls for interview and selection.

The first segment of Ingalls' three-part program started December 2, 1963, with an enrollment of 30 students.

During the pre-employment period--approximately three months--students attend classes eight hours a day, five days a week. Training is being conducted at the company's Small Boat Division Facility just north of the main plant and is under the direction of specially-trained Ingalls instructors.
