FISH ACTUALLY dominate the waters of our planet, just as the waters on the earth dominate its surface. There are more fish-

and more different kinds of fish- than any other animals of any size living wholly or partly in water.

Today we are able to identify more than 25,000 different kinds of fish- as many species as there are of mammals, birds, reptiles and amphibians put together.

To cover so varied a group of animals with a single definition—one that will include all kinds of fish and at the same time exclude all the living things that are not fish— is difficult. Fish are so varied in the nature of their bodies and the way they use their organs, that exceptions turn up for almost every characteristic of fish in general.

FOR EXAMPLES, some fish have no scales; others have no fins; a few lack jaws, a number do not breathe primarily by means of gills, and many spend practically as much time out of the water as in it! (This is a fish?)

Technically, a fish is a cold-blooded, acquatic verterbrate . . . with gills . . . and a two-chambered heart. I am sure you will agree about them being cold-blooded. But some of you may well dispute whether all of them have a heart.

cent from the free-throw line. This year he only bagged 104 charity tosses but his average went up to 71 per cent due to fewer chances.

Stepp's largest scoring splurge of the past season came against Chapman College in the first round of the Kris Kringle tournament at Anaheim, Calif., when he scored 32 points. The following night, against the stronger Cal Polyteam he played a better all-around game in notching 23 points and hauling down 20 rebounds. 


