STATE SAYS HAWTHORNE BIGOT HAS NO CASE

RIGHTS COMMISSION DEFENDED BY WALSH

RENC--Efforts by Hawthorne restaurant and casino operator Lindsay Smith to have the Nevada Equal Rights Commission declared unconstitutional are being vigorously opposed by the state attorney general's

Deputy Atty. Gen. Daniel Walsh has submitted a 14-pount brief in district court contending that Smith has no grounds for a \$263,000 damage suit against the commission as well as Smith's request for a declaratory judgment finding the commission unconstitutional.

Smith, who operates the El Capitan Restaurant-Casino at Hawthorne, secured a temporary restraining order preventing the commission from calling him to testify about alleged discrimination practices at the establishment. Smith claims the commission has invaded his privacy, harassed him without just cause and damaged his business.

In opposing Smith's request for a perdiscrimination."

Basing his request for dismissal of Smith's suit on the doctrine of sovereign immunity, Walsh denied the commission had invaded Smith's privacy because, "When the plaintiff opens his doors of public accomodation and refuses to serve a portion of the public on the basis of color, he becomes an actor in an occurence of public or general interest and the doctrine of right of privacy is not applicable."

It was recalled that in 1962 Smith testified at a hearing that he does not serve Negroes. An El Capitan Casino spokesman reiterated that policy at a 1963 hearing.

LAW OFFICERS MEET WITH CIVIC LEADERS

A SERIES of conferences between West Las Vegas civic leaders and city law enforcement officials to discuss problems in human relations are being arranged for the near future as part of a city-wide program.

Plans for the proposed conferences were outlined at a recent meeting of the Police-Community Relations Committee of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Dr. Heinz Rettig, executive director of the Nevada NCCJ, has suggested that the present committee be expanded to include more educators, clergymen and representatives of civic organizations.

"WE AREN'T satisfied with the way our present police-community relations program has been working," Dr. Rettig said. "The expanded program should promote better harmony between law enforcement officials and the public."

Las Vegas Police Dept. Chief Leo Kuykendall said he "welcomed" the proposal for an enlarged committee and predicted it would help formulate policies on such important issues as civil rights, juvenile delinquency and gun laws.
