WORKING AHEAD ON MENUS

PLANNING meals for three or four days, or as much as a week ahead, is standard practice in good food management. Advance planning makes it possible for you to have more adequate meals, to save time and motions, and to spend more wisely. It is easier and quicker to check the meals for several days.

Although planning meals ahead is both a necessity and a convenience to the homemaker, no plan should be followed so closely that last-minute changes cannot be made. The opportunity to obtain unexpected food items, perhaps at an especially low price, should not be overlooked.

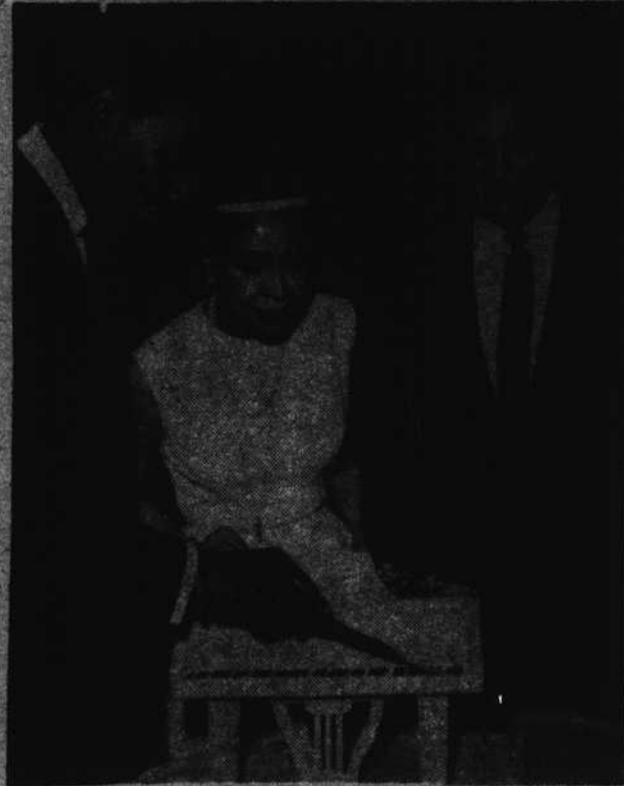
Planned meals are usually more interesting than unplanned ones because there is less tendency to repeat foods prepared by the same methods and in the same combinations. Even repeating the same menu once a week for several consecutive weeks is uninteresting.

Food on hand, scarce food, or expensive food can be used to better advantage with advance planning. You have greater poise and peace of mind if you avoid uncertainty about what to serve for the next meal. Through planning you may gain more leisure.

STORING WINTER WEAR

ments, gloves, hats, bags and shoes.

First thing always first. Remember that before storage, cleaning is necessary for proper care. Some things to never forget along these lines are:

1. Cleaning fluids, shoe creams or leather soaps should never be used on fashion leathers as they might cause darkening of the leather or streaks.
2. Let the cleaners do the professional job on your leather and suede garments--don't take the chance yourself.
3. Do not wash leather gloves unless they are absolutely guaranteed washable.

Hints about storage:

1. When storing gloves in dresser drawers, wrap them in tissue paper, not in plastic. Do not place dark colored gloves near the lighter ones.
2. Leather is animal skin and needs to breathe, so do not use plastic garment bags for storage.
