which will mark Dr. King's first appearance in this area.

In disclosing preliminary plans for this year's civil rights demonstrations in the South, Dr. King said that although the "big push" will be centered in Montgomery, Ala., "we will not neglect other critical areas."

Predicting a "long, hot summer" in terms of civil rights struggles, Dr. King said, "I think we will see demonstrations on a level and size of a much greater magnitude than ever before."

In addition to the Alabama drive, Dr. King said the SCLC is trying to organize at least 1,500 students from western and

northern colleges and universities for a summer campaign in Mississippi.

DR. KING ALSO SAID that if the filibuster in the U. S. Senate against the civil rights bill is prolonged "beyond the point of reasonable debate for the purpose of denying the Senate an opportunity to vote on this vital measure . . . then we definitely plan demonstrations in Washington and supportive action throughout the country."

## Nevada Health Projects Seek \$200,000 Grants

WASHINGTON—Approximately \$200,000 is being requested for construction of Nevada

community mental health and retardation centers in fiscal year 1965.

The amount has been included in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare's budget for expenditures in the states on a matching basis.

Sen. Howard Cannon said estimates for Nevada include \$100,000 for comprehensive community health centers and \$100,000 for state retardation centers.

All funds carry over for one year. If the funds are not used by July 1, 1965, they will be available through July 1, 1966.

In regard to the presidential election campaigns, Dr. King said he plans to promote massive, intensified registration drives in northern communities this summer.

"We have studied marginal districts all over the United States," he said, "particularly where congressmen have been lukewarm in their support for civil rights legislation or openly opposed to reforms and we know that a few additional votes could defeat them."

Dr. King revealed that he will call a conference in the fall to launch a selective buying program on a national scale. He said the program will be an extension of "Operation Breadbasket" in Atlanta, where Negroes report significant gains in employment through negotiations coupled with threats of boycotts.

"COMPREHENSIVE SURVEYS of Negro spending are now being made and studied," Dr. King said. "We already have established that Negro spending can make the difference between profit and loss in most industries."
