(2) OUTSTANDING MEMBER- to the member other than an officer of the local branch who had contributed most to NAACP programs.

(3) EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES-to the person or firm doing the most outstanding work in opening new jobs to Negroes.

(4) OUTSTANDING SERVICE- to the member of the local branch who has made the greatest effort in the planning and operation of NAACP activities.

Clyde Mathews, Martin Black, Lucille Gee, Virgie Fitzgerald, Armin Behr, Ray Sturm, James Anderson, Pat Schoppe, Charles Kellar, Dr. Charles West, Rev. Marion Bennett, Sahara Hotel, Southwest Gas Corp. and the Central Telephone Co., Southern Nevada Division.

narrow margin of 168 votes-2812 to 2644. Approval of the \$400,000 Doolittle recreation center issue was by the even closer majority of 102 votes-2791 to 2689.

Westside voters approved both these issues by better than 5-1 margins!
