Jones, 27, San Francisco, is in the Air Force at Hamilton Field. Art defeated clever Gerry Lott, the defending 119-lb. champion from New Orleans, in the finals.

Charles Brown is a 25-year-old career Marine from Camden, Ohio, near Cincinnati, now stationed at Camp Pendleton, Oceanside, Calif. Charles is married, has three children, and hopes to become a Marine officer.

Harris is a 17-year-old student at Chadsey High, Detroit, Mich. Ron intends

to try his hand at pro boxing.

Ward, 24, lives in Portland, Ore., with his wife and one child. He is a crane operator for Bethlehem Steel. Cross, 21, also is from Portland and attends Community College in that city.

WILSON, WHO GAVE MATHIS a rough time of it in the heavyweight final despite a weight disadvantage of 92 pounds, is a 26-year-old career Marine at Camp Pendleton. His home town is McKeesport, Pa.

Brooks is a 16-year-old Phoenix, Ariz., school boy who aspires to become a pro boxing champion. Davis, 19, lives in Salt Lake City and works for the Union Pacific Railroad. He also intends to turn pro and should make a good one. Daniels, 23, divides his allegiance between Seattle, Wash. and Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, where he is in Special Services. He was a bronze medal (third place) winner in the 1960 Olympics at Rome Italy, and the Pan-American Games in Brazil last year.

McMillian, a 19-year-old high school senior in Toledo, Ohio, expects to go into pro boxing and has championship possibilities. Apparently the victim of poor judgment by an inexperienced referee in his final bout with Cross, Bob had luckily already qualified for the Olympic trials in New York in June by winning a National Golden Gloves title at Louisville this year.

Afrikaner 'KKK' Active

SOUTH AFRICA has its own Ku Klux Klan in the form of a semi-secret society called Die Broederbond-- the Brotherhood or Bond of Brothers.

Apparently founded in post World War I days, its basic aim is to further the interests of descendants of the early Boer settlers who now comprise more than half the white population of the Republic. Other whites in South Africa are mainly of British origin.

Anti-government newspaper cartoonists depict the Broeders as comical little men in KKK-type hoods and cloaks. But serious critics claim the society is much more influential than its American counterpart.

Prime Minister Hendrik Verwoerd, strong man of the police-state, white supremacy government, recently told parliament that he has been a Broeder for 25 years. Parliament has been probing the effect of secret societies such as the Broederbond.

During World War II, Prime Minister Field Mar-

shall Jan Christian Smuts barred government workers from joining the Broederbond because of its pro-Nazi sympathies.
