NEGRO POPULATION -- "In 1962 there were an estimated 20 million Negroes in the U.S. Their proportion in the population has been growing since 1930 as a result of their higher birth rate and the striking reducation in their death rate. In 1963 the median age for nonwhites was 22, more than 7 years below that of whites. Fourteen percent of the population under 20 were nonwhites."

LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION-There were 8.1 million nonwhite workers in 1963, representing 63 percent of the nonwhite civilian population, 14 years and over, a participation rate 55 percent above that of whites.

OCCUPATIONS- Occupational advances of nonwhites continue in the postwar period but at a slower rate. Percentagewise, as compared to whites, advances in some
