REPUBLICANS 'STRIKE OUT' AGAIN

As the Review-Journal so aptly put it in an editorial this week, Nevada Republicans "have done it again" by refusing to entertain any reasonable suggestions regarding new civil rights legislation in this state.

"Once more they have tackled the business of government and politics--not as statesmen--but like a group of provincial shopkeepers" the Review-Journal points out. The Clark County Republican Central Committee's civil rights resolutions, according to the R-J, "were the same old piece of irrationality offered at the last state convention. The party is gallantly attempting the rights of the majority against encroachment by civil rights legislation. There is a contradiction in that position which the Republicans will not tumble to for another 20 years. Furthermore, if the GOP has decided to protect the rights of the majority then they had better find out why the majority consistently fails to reciprocate at the polls."

All we can do is add a sorrowful "amen" and express the hope that all Republican candidates for office this year do not feel bound by the John Birch Society philosophy that permeates the party of Abraham Lincoln in this state at the present time.
