PETE BROWN FARES WELL

PETE BROWN, first Negro to win a major 72-hole PGA golf tournament, proved he can play with the best of them last weekend when he finished in a tie for 13th place in the hitherto segregated Colonial National at Fort Worth, Texas.

The 29-year-old Los Angeles pro, who was invited to play at Fort Worth off his victory at Barney-ville, Okla., the pre-vious week, scored 76-70-71-73-290 in the Colonial, 11 strokes behind winner Billy Casper but good for his second largest purse, \$1,620. Pete took down \$2,700 at Burneyville.

Brown was tied with such fine golfers as Lionel Hebert and Doug Sanders at Fort Worth and finished ahead of Tony Lema, Billy Maxwell, George Knudson and Phil Rodgers by one stroke; the great Jack Nicklaus, Bob Charles and Art Wall by two; Bob Rosburg and Julius Boros by three;
