

Los Angeles Police authority." Inspector James G. Fish met with members of the Council of Community Churches Ministerial Council and the Interdenominational Ministers Alliance this week in an effort to iron out difficulties between the LA Police Dept. and the Negro community. Speaking for the

Council, the Rev. Maurice Dawkins, a Negro, said: "As clergy, we in-

tend to join hands with the Police Department in the prevention of riots and racial conflicts, but the mayor. and other officials must understand that fear and suspicion and resentment against the department are based on facts regarding abuse of police

The Rev. Dawkins said Mayor Samuel Yorty's reference to "irresponsible lead-ers" in the Negro community in discussing the police situat-ion "indicates an inaccurate appraisal of the resentment in the Negro community toward methods being employed by the chief of police and his de-partment. "Mayor Yorty does not help the situation by labeling as 'irresponsible' all those who protest questionable police practices." Dawkins said.
