When we find the candidate who scores highest in these eight categories, WE MUST PUT ALL OUR EGGS IN HIS ONE BASKET!

Friendship, sentiment and previous commitments must be ignored in selecting the right candidate. We must not permit these factors to influence our decision unless a candidate successfully meets the tests mentioned above.

Let us see what would happen if we did not put all our eggs in one basket—cast all our votes for ONE man.

REMEMBERING that the common purpose is to defeat Walter Baring and replace him with a candidate who measures highest in the qualities mentioned above, let us take an arbitrary figure of 7,500 Negro voters trying to choose from four names on the Democratic ballot for U. S. Congressman.

If we split those 7,500 votes equally among Baring's three opponents, each would receive 2,500. This would mean that Baring would have to pick up only 2,500 votes elsewhere to nullify our efforts to retire him.

However, if we put all our 7,500 political eggs in one basket by giving all our votes to one man, Baring would require three times 2,500 "right wing" votes to overcome his opposition.

It is easy to see, therefore, why the Negro vote must be unified into a solid bloc. It is imperative in our own best interests. The military adage of "divide and conquer" would prove disastrous to all our efforts if we do not develop our full political potential through unity. The Negro voter who thinks overwise is aiding and abetting the enemies of Civil Rights.

Walter Baring has publicly declared his opposition to our aspirations for social and political justice. He is working against us. We must declare our opposition to Walter Baring and work against him. We must all pull together and not let any factor or faction pull us apart. United we cannot lose; divided we cannot win.

Walter Baring has been quoted as saying that the present "Rights" movement is only 10 per cent Civil Rights and 90 per cent "Special Rights." Apparently, he also believes that the Negro should enjoy only 10 per cent of the rights, opportunities and amenities that he, himself, enjoys.

The VOICE urgently appeals to its readers, individually and collectively, to express strong resentment toward every public official who does not believe in the democratic principle of equality by employing the telling power of a unified vote.

The Negro, fighting for his full rights as a citizen, will eventually brighten the face of democracy by removing the scars of racism which mar its image. Each Negro voter can easily persuade two Caucasian voters who believe in democracy to help us create a better picture of America. Such a coalition would add up to certain defeat for Walter Baring.

The VOICE will assemble and present an accurate accounting of how each candidate who opposes Baring scores in the qualification test outlined in this editorial. We urge you to wait and watch for these ratings before committing yourself to support of any candidate.

IN DEFENDING Welch and the Birchers from alleged "deliberate distortion of the facts" by the American press and "other public media", Rousselot referred to Welch as "a minority voice. We know we are all minority voices. But it should be remembered that Christ was one of the few people of His time who disagreed with the principle of crucifixtion."

Noting that Rousselot failed to show when or where Christ "disagreed with the principle of crucifixion," one clergyman present recalled that according to the Bible, Christ had come into the world as a saviour of all its people and had forecast his own crucifixion in explation of mortal sin.

(At almost the same time Rousselot was delivering his harrangues here, evangelist Billy Graham was telling a gathering in Chapel Hill, N. C. that "those who say the Bible supports segregation just don't know their Bible.")
