all Americans, regardless of race or creed. . . the absolute guarantee that no citizen may be stripped of human dignity simply because he happens to be a member of a minority group.

To the bigots and hate-mongers who say Mr. Kennedy did not represent the mainstream of American thought and opinion, we can only reply that few men in any age have ever struck such a responsive chord in the hearts of the people. Since he was buried by a grieving nation at Arlington National Cemetery six months ago, more than two million citizens have silently passed his grave. They are attracted not by a monument, for there is none, but by a profound respect for a man who offered so much of himself to this great nation.

I think it entirely appropriate on this occasion to announce the opening of an important campaign in Nevada. . . a campaign to raise funds for the proposed John F. Kennedy Library in Boston. This magnificent edifice, to be built at a cost of 10 million dollars, will house the important documents and momentos of the Kennedy Administration.

As chairman of the fund-raising committee in Nevada, I would like to urge every citizen to contribute as generously as possible to this worthy cause. Although no state goals have been set by the national committee, Nevada will be expected to raise at least \$15,000.

THE CAMPAIGN OPENS TODAY, on the anniversary of President Kennedy's birth. It will close November 22, the anniversary of his death.

The Library will include three major components. . . a museum, an archive and an institute.

The museum will house the many mementoes associated with the late President. Visitors will be able to see his rocking chair, a hand-written draft of his Inaugural Address, gifts from 171 heads of states, and the coconut shell he used in the Pacific to send word that he and the crew of PT 109 were still alive.

Those responsible for furnishing the Library will use the most modern devices of electronics and design to insure that the museum is not a dry and musty collection of artifacts, but a vital recreation of the most exciting reminders of the Kennedy era.

The archive will contain President Kennedy's personal papers, as well as copies of public records necessary for an understanding of his Administration. It will be used primarily by scholars and researchers.

Since many of the discussions leading up to the key policies of the Kennedy Administration were never recorded, a unique oral history is planned. Under this program, important world leaders and government officials from the United States and other nations have been asked to record their recollection of pertinent discussions with the late President.

The institute will have as its central purpose the education of young people in the understanding and practice of democratic political life. It will also try to bring together the world of ideas and the world of public affairs.
