




Matt. 4:19 These words of Jesus were meant to be taken seriously and for all time. Who of us today

would dare address them to any of our fellow men; even to our children?

We do, of course, seek to influence others by our word and example. Yet there can be no

doubt that he did say, and still says, "Fol-low me," and there is no escape from the inner meaning and implication of these words. Christianity reduced to the simplest language and to its main essential means following Christ; walking his way; copying him, in the sense of showing forth in our lives his spirit. It means ac-cepting his leadership.

There is, of course, great comfort and strength to be found in this truth that in embracing Christianity we are asked to be followers of Christ. It means that we are not asked to take a leap into the dark. We are not asked to follow an untried way, nor to launch out into an uncharted sea. What we have to do is to follow; to walk a way that has been walked before. It was walked by Jesus and has been walked by countless others before us. It is a known and tried way we are asked to follow.

But if this much is true, bringing as it does comfort and strength and inspiration, it is also true that this invitation of Jesus presents us with a challenge and with a demand. Following implies effort and discipline. The way is open, but we have to follow it. Leadership requires a response, and unless response is forthcoming leadership will prove of little avail. If men and nations refuse to follow the way of Christ they cannot, and will not, enter into fullness of life.

First, our following implies a dedication of ourselves to Him. It means a personal response which we, ourselves, have to make. It implies a personal commitment of our lives to His way of life. Now Jesus did not ask the first disciples to wait until they felt worthy to become his followers. He called them that he might make them disciples.

Second, following implies a dedication of our-selves not only to Christ, but to one another. Jesus called men into a fellowship, the fellowship which later inevitably became the Christian Church. It was a group of men he called, a group of men he invited to eat and drink with him at the Last Supper, not simply a number of isolated individuals. It is of the very essence of Chris-tianity that the followers of Christ should join their fellow Christians in the fellowship and service of the Church.

Both these truths have other and far-reaching implications, but taken together they are fundamental and essential. This is what is meant and implied in following Christ. These are the
