CALIFORNIA'S FIRST NEGRO MAYOR!

We were proud as punch last week to note another important milestone in the progress of Negro Americans when George Carroll, 41-year-old Brooklyn-born attorney, was named Mayor of Richmond, Calif. You can get an idea of Mayor Carroll's achievement from the fact that only about 20 per cent of Richmond's population of 79,800 is colored.

Mayor Carroll probably is the first chief executive of a major American city since Reconstruction days. Of

construction days. Of course, some all-Negro towns in the deep South have Negro mayors, but none of them are anywhere near the size of Richmond.

The new mayor was elected to the Richmond City Council in 1961 and became mayor last week through unanimous choice of

unanimous choice of
his eight white colleagues on the council. The
councilmen noted that Garroll had been elected
on the basis of qualification and merit and all,
paid tribute to the splendid character and pleasing personality of their new mayor. He will
serve for one year with the possibility of reappointment.

Mayor Carroll's selection to head the city government of Richmond is consonant with the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and symbolic of the Negro's move into the mainstream of American socio-political life.

(Interesting sidelight: Mayor Carroll's father came from Richmond, Virginia!)
