Negro Principal in Newark

NEWARK, N.J.--The first Negro principal in Newark's school system in more than half a century received her appointment from the city board of education last week.

Dr. E. Alma Flagg has been placed in charge of the Hawkins School in the Ironbound section, which has a considerable white student body.

The only previous Negro principal in Newark was James M. Baxter, who headed Newark's old Colored School for 45 years. He retired in 1909, shortly before his death.

Dr. Flagg finished second in written and oral competitive examinations. She was among nine new principals appointed last week.

Dr. Flagg became vice principal of the Garfield School last year after 20 years as a tea-cher. She holds a Doctor of Education degree from Columbia University. Her husband, J. Thomas Flagg, is a Newark school teacher.
