**Baskin Deserves Second
Term as Commissioner**

Local government is becoming increasingly important and increasingly complex in Clark county due to the rapid growth of our population.

It is this very rapidity of growth that makes it necessary for us to have locally elected officials who will serve with honesty, integrity and dedication—resisting the opportunities for exploitation which go hand-in-hand with our boom times.

And if the word integrity fits any locally elected official it must certainly apply to County Commissioner Bob Baskin, now seeking his second term on the five-member board.

It is the general policy of this newspaper to support the reelection of incumbent officeholders unless there seems to be general public dissatisfaction with them, or unless there appear to be other overriding reasons why they should be replaced.

This is not the case with Bob Baskin. In fact, we believe that his record as a businessman, civic leader, city official and how county official serves as ample reason for this newspaper to commend him to the voters for reelection.

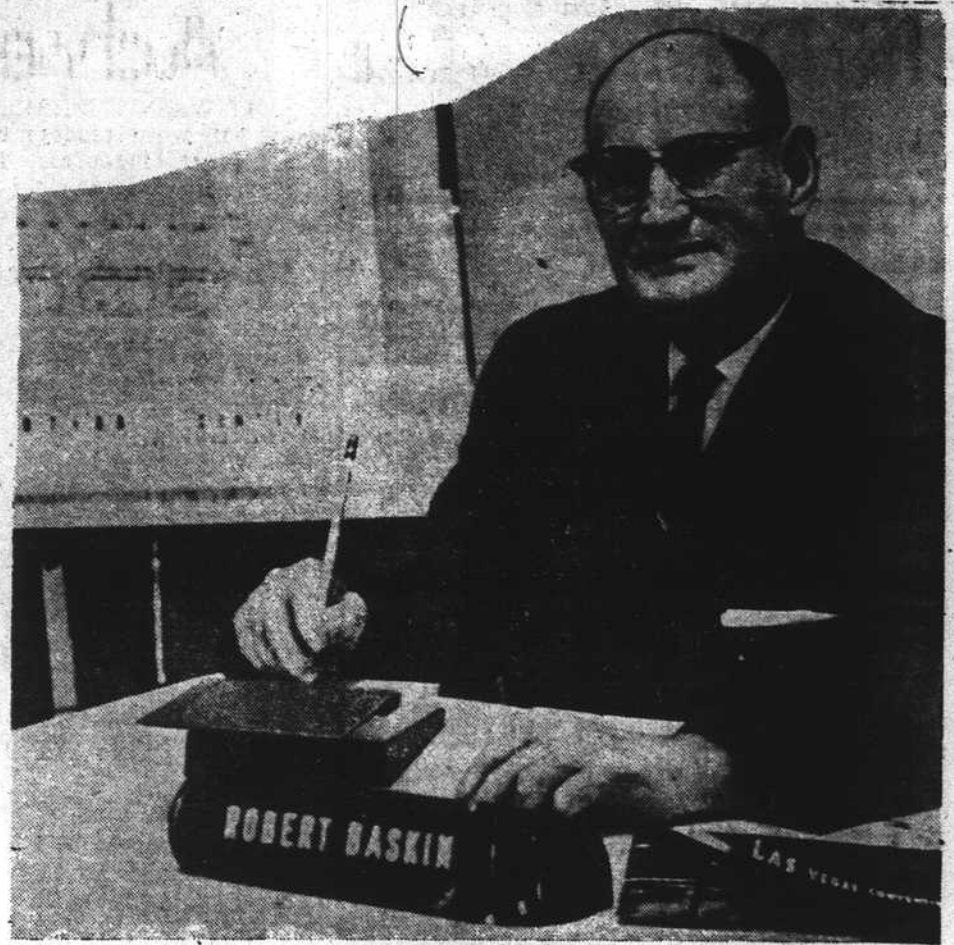
