GEORGIANS RENOMINATE "RIGHTS"LAW BACKERS

ATLANTA, Ga.-A Georgia Congressman who managed President Johnson's anti-poverty bill in the House and his Georgia colleague who voted for the Civil Rights Bill were renominated last week.

Rep. Phil Landrum, a "major general" in the President's war on poverty, defeated Zell Miller, a state senator and former professor, by a 5-4 margin in the 9th District race.

In the 5th District, Rep. Charles R. Weltner won over attorney Wyman C, Lowe, a conservative, by better than 3-2.

President Johnson had endorsed Landrum

during an appearance early in the summer at Gainsville, Ga., but Miller ran a nip-and-tuck race with the incumbent until Landrum pulled out ahead in the late returns.

Weltner's victory in the Atlanta 5th District over Lowe, who was making his third unsuccessful race, was the second victory rolled up by a Deep South congressman who dared break tradition and support the Civil Rights Bill.

The other Civil Rights proponent, Rep. Ross Bass of Tennessee who represented a district bordering Alabama, defeated Gov. Frank Clement last Aug. 6 in a race for the Democratic nomination to the Senate.
