Distribute City Curfew Law

IN ORDER TO PREVENT MISUNDERSTANDING concerning provisions of the Las Vegas Municipal Ordinance pertaining to child curfew regulations within the city limits, several thousand copies of the law are being distributed throughout the community.

The one-page handbills spelling out curfew regulations for minors under the age of 18 years are signed by Las Vegas Chief of Police Leo E. Kuykendall and are being distributed through the courtesy of the Las Vegas Police Dept. and the Clark County Citizens Council.

The city ordinance, comprising code sections 6-8-6, 6-8-7 and 6-8-8, follows:

"CURFEW: It shall be unlawful for any child under the age of eighteen (18) years without being on any lawful business or engaged in any lawful occupation, not accompanied by its parents or guardian or other adult person having legal care, custody and control of said child, to loiter, idle, wander or stroll or be upon, in or about any of the public streets, avenues, alleys or other public places in the City at any

time between the hour of 10:00 PM, Sunday through Thursday, both inclusive, and 5:00 AM of the succeeding day, and between the hours of 12:00 midnight on Friday and Saturday and 5:00 AM, of the succeeding day; provided, however, that upon the written request of the principal or superintendent of any high school in Clark County to the Chief of Police, said Chief of Police shall be empowered, after first having given notice by publication in a newspaper of general circulation, to extend the curfew on special occasions to 1:00 AM.

"PARENTS RESPONSIBLE: It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian, or other person having legal care, custody and control of any child under the age of eighteen (18) years to allow or permit such child or ward to loiter, idle, wander or stroll or be upon, in or about any of the public streets, avenues, alleys, or other public places in the City not accompanied by such parent, guardian or other persons having legal care, custody and control of such child,
