Elliott, Johnson Veep Nominees

ELECTION OF OFFICERS to lead the Las Vegas branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) during 1965 will be conducted on Sunday, Dec. 13, at 3 p.m. at Kit Carson School.

Nominations for various branch offices and the executive committee were made at the regular November meeting last Sunday, with the Rev. Marion Bennett, incumbent, named to contest for the presidency with attorney Earle White.

The Rev. Bennett was selected to run for another term by a nominating committee headed by B. Bernice Moten and including James Anderson, J. Q. Hall, Ezra Davis and John Buckles. White was nominated from the floor.

Marjorie Elliott and the Rev. Leo Johnson were nominated from the floor to vie for first vice president after the nominating committee failed to recommend a candidate for this office or for the second vice presidency.

Muriel Simpson was the nominating committee's choice to run for secretary while Mary Bishop was nominated for this office from the floor. Henry Moore was the committee's selection for treasurer.

Nineteen members were selected by the nominating committee as candidates for the executive committee, including incumbents J. Q. Hall, Eileen Brookman, Lamar McDaniels,

MADISON, KELLY PTA'S MEET TONIGHT

IT'S "BACK TO SCHOOL" tonight (Nov. 12) for parents of Madison School pupils and other adult members of the community.

The 8 p.m. program, during which parents and friends of the school will be provided the opportunity of experiencing a typical lesson taught by one of the teachers at each grade level, is a feature of Madison's observance of American Education Week planned by Principal Dr. Joseph Caliguri and his faculty.

Tonight's get-together will take place in the Multi-purpose Room of the Madison Ave. and 'J' St. school. Refreshments and entertainment will be provided those attending.

Parents and friends were invited to visit with teachers and students at Madison School all through this week, with classrooms operating on an "open house" basis and opportunities provided for visitors to ask questions--and receive answers--about the school program.

Other joint parent-teacher-student features of the week-long observance included a Veter-

ans Day assembly, with the school Safety Patrol and Drum Band featuring a program emphasizing the theme of "World Peace", and daily 9 a.m. school assemblies to be continued tomorrow morning (Friday, Nov. 13).

One of the prime objectives of American Education Week is to provide parents and other members of the community with an opportunity to see the school in actual operation and provide face-to-face communication with teachers under actual "working conditions."

Dr. Caliguri emphasized that parents and friends are free to continue visits to the school throughout the year.

Free Chest X-Rays Available Monday

WEST LAS VEGAS will be provided with an opportunity to receive free chest x-rays without leaving the community starting next Monday, Nov. 16.

The Nevada Tuberculosis and Health Association and the Nevada State Department of Health are cooperating in making the most modern equipment available in a mobile unit that will be stationed adjacent to Jefferson Recreation Center, 'D' and Adams Sts., from Nov. 16 through Saturday, Nov. 21. The unit will be moved to the Golden West Shopping Center on Monday, Nov. 23.

Technicians will be on duty Mondays through Saturdays from 12 noon to 8 p.m. to take the chest x-rays. The entire procedure requires only a few minutes, is absolutely painless and 100 per cent safe, and costs exactly nothing. Cards denoting the result of tests are mailed to each recipient within one month.

Children taking the tests must be accompanied by their parents or a responsible adult.
