WASHINGTON, D.C.--From beginning to end, "everything in the Bible rejects extremism," according to the Rev. Dr. George R. Davis of the National City Christian Church, where President Johnson often worships.

Quoting the words of Jesus, St. Paul and other Biblical figures, the minister sought to demonstrate that extremism flies in the face of accepted religious values.

He accused extremists of fanaticism, se-cretiveness and other failings, and said "the Bible does not offer blessing or encouragement" for any of these.

With extremists "it's all out or nothing, he said, but St. Paul advised the Philippians, "Let your moderation be known unto all men."
