AN UNVEILING CEREMONY and Thanksgiving Dinner will feature a special holiday program at St. James Baptist Church tonight (Nov. 26) at 8 o'clock. Due for unveiling are a bell, star and new neon sign, with Las Vegas Police Chief Leo Kuykendall throwing the light switch.

Speakers at the dinner, which will be provided for a small donation, include State Assemblymen Vernon Bunker and Helen Herr, Clark County Commissioner-elect Darwin Lamb, Municipal Judge Walter Richards and Dr. Newton W. Tigner, local churchman and one-time associate of Booker T. Washington.

Ceremonies will be conducted by the Rev. J. L. Simmons, St. James pastor, and his associates. The Rev. V.C.L. Coleman will deliver the Scripture lesson from Matthew 2:2. Other messages will be delivered by the Rev. I. W. Wilson (Daniel 12:3), the Rev. E. C. Kline (Genesis 1:3) and the Rev. M. D. Bennett (Revelations 1:10 through 4:1). A prayer will be offered by the Rev. A. B. Carr.

They also will be making a contribution to a permanent memorial to our martyred champion, John Fitzgerald Kennedy. All proceeds from the ball and dinner will go to the Kennedy Library Fund.

Tickets for the combined dinner and ball will cost \$25 per plate. Admission to the ball only for non-diners will cost \$5 per couple. Reservations may be made by addressing "Governor's Gala", P.O. Box 2570, Las Vegas.

We shall have more information on this affair in next week's edition. In the meantime, we again appeal to all of you to make arrangements to honor Gov. Sawyer and the memory of former President Kennedy by attending the big ball and dinner on Dec. 12.

All golfers with established handicaps acceptable to the Nevada State Golf Association are eligible to compete. Attractive prizes will be awarded to the leaders in five men's divisions and two for women.

Principal interest in the men's championship division centers on attempts by James Slatten of San Francisco and Bob Taylor of Henderson, Nev., to retire the John DeLuca Trophy. Both Slatten and Taylor hold two legs on the trophy and can take it home "for keeps" by again scoring the lowest 36-hole gross total in this year's event.

A cocktail party for all participants is scheduled for Friday night at 7 o'clock at the Carver House, with presentation of trophies slated for the tournament banquet starting at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, also at the Carver House.
