## LBJ Cracks Down on Job Bias

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Acting under the Civil Rights Act of 1964, President Johnson has ordered abolition of racial discrimination from all programs operated or partially financed by seven federal agencies.

A new federal regulation signed by the President last week assures that government aid or employment will not be denied any individual because of his race, color or national origin. The regulation becomes effective on Jan. 2, 1965.

Covered by the regulation are programs administered by the Interior, Agriculture, Labor and Health, Education and Welfare Departments; the Housing and Home Finance Agency; the General Services Administration and the National Science Foundation.

The directive is retroactive to the extent that it would force desegregation of facilities which were built with federal funds and are still receiving such aid.

But the regulation would have no effect, for example, on segregated hospitals constructed in the South some years ago under the Hill-Burton Act and which no longer receive federal assistance.

President Johnson plans to issue additional regulations banning racial discrimination from activities of other federal departments and agencies.

In announcing the initial directive, Mr. Johnson said:

"This nation's commitment to the principle of equality of treatment and opportunity for all Americans will be well served by the new regulations assuring that federal programs are available to all citizens without regard to their race, color or national origin."

The directive was the first approved by Mr. Johnson to implement Title VI of the Civil Rights Act. That section states that "no person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance."
