sonnel policies have too long failed to recognize this necessity, as brought out in recent studies such as the Havighurst survey of the Chicago public schools, which particularly recommends properly integrated staffs.

Solution of the problem of properly staffing schools in disadvantaged areas should not be too difficult. All that is necessary is a little vision and effort. The easily discernible aca-demic and social benefits to all Negro and white children should inspire the vision and well repay the effort.


