children of equal educational opportunities. And many educators are satisfied that abolition of this evil practice, if and when it is truly achieved, will greatly benefit American society as a whole.

In summarizing this brief review of significant civil rights legislation and high judicial decisions since the Civil War, beginning with ratification of the 13th Amendment and contin-

uing through the 1954 Supreme Court edict and the Civil Rights Act of 1964, we are happy to report that the American Negro apparently is well on his way to "overcoming all."

If it is rank bigotry to oppose the cause of Negro freedom from a humanistic standpoint, it is sheer bypocrisy to deny the Negro complete emancipation on legalistic grounds when one considers that the Congress affirmed this inalienable constitutional right almost 100 years ago in the Civil Rights Act of 1866.

The preponderance of high judicial support for Negro justice provides a rich chapter in the history of American education in particular. The evidence clearly indicates that the Great Society may eventually become a fact rather than a political fantasy. One may even dream that segregation in housing as a major impediment to cultural and educational fulfillment for the Negro sooner or later will go the same route as the discredited "separate but equal" principle once applied to education in certain sections of this country.
