Office Space Needed for County Aid Programs

ORDERLY CONTINUANCE of West Las Vegas "self-help" projects sponsored by Operation Independence has been jeopardized by a lack of suitable office space.

Senators Howard Cannon and Alan Bible of Nevada announced from Washington, D.C., Tuesday that a federal grant of \$56,027 has been approved for "anti-poverty" programs in Clark County. However, it was understood that the funds may be held up until space is obtained here to establish an administrative office in conformance with a requirement that a community indicate its willingness to match about 10 per cent of the government grant.

Office space of about 800 square feet is necessary to meet requirements for allocation of the federal grant. Clark County has been allotted \$175,000 for anti-poverty programs if

Staffing of the office will be provided by federal funds and is included in the application for \$66,317 to house the office when space is available and to continue operation of the Child Care Center and other projects in West Las Vegas now being conducted by Operation Independence.

A study also is being made at the present time of the migrant worker problem in Clark County looking toward an application for additional funds under the Economic Opportunities Act.
