GROW UP! GROW IN!


Text: "But Grow in Grace and in the Knowledge of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him Be Glory Both Now and Forever." II Pet.

The words of the text must be regarded as St. Peter's "last words" insofar as they are recorded in Holy Scripture. They concern "growing up," or rather "growing in." As the

apostle's last words they deserve special

notice. It is a common fea-ture of living things that they grow--alnature of their growth

vary immensely. St. Peter's words refer to spiritual growth. He pleads that we might "grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." This growth cannot be measured with a foot rule or checked by an I. Q. test, for it is a



There are four essentials for human growth --life and food, activity, and rest. Neglect any one of these and there is trouble, for growth is arrested and instead of a fine, healthy develop-ment there is distortion and decay.

LIFE. The first requirement for growth is life. Unless life is there to begin with, nothing will grow.

There must be life for growth, physical and spiritual. We receive both from God. The first indirectly through our parents, the second directly through Jesus Christ. We must be "in Christ" to be spiritually alive. "I am come," He said, "that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

FOOD. Even when we are alive physically

we do not stay alive long if we stop taking food.
It is a case of "food for growth" and "grow as you feed" in the spiritual sense. Our soul's true food brings us back again to Jesus Christ.
"For," records John, "the bread of God is He
which cometh down from heaven and giveth life to the world.'

ACTIVITY. Yet another requirement for

growth is activity or exercise.

Anemic and feeble Christianity may be the result of less than energetic participation in Christian "warfare." Each passing year involves us in some difficulties and problems of a spiritual nature. We shall grow as we grapple with them and master them in our Lord's strength--not as we run away from them or fear them. We grow as we endure affliction and strive against sin; as we become actively in-volved in the whole Christian enterprise of worship and witness. We should always be ready to quicken our pace in answer to the call of the hymn, "Onward Christian soldiers, marching as to war; with the cross of Jesus, going on before!"

REST. It will not be true growth unless there time for rest. A rhytl is essential for spiritual growth.

There is a time when activity ceases and we can refresh ourselves in the knowledge that God is with us, sustaining us, caring for us. "Come ye yourselves apart," said our Lord to His disciples, "and rest awhile."

Life, food, activity and rest are the four conditions of spiritual as well as physical growth. We shall grow in grace as we pay attention to these four requirements.
