

# Here's Final Advice On Social Security

(This is the final article in a four-part series on Social Security administration prepared for VOICE readers by Ed Cocks, district manager of the Bureau of Old Age and Survivors Insurance. If you are receiving social security benefits, you can do much to insure that you receive all your checks on time. You can inform the Social Security Administration of certain changes in your situation as soon as they occur or in advance, if possible.

If you change your address, for example, the Social Security Administration must be informed of this before the middle of the month in order to send your next check to the new address. If you are unable to notify the social

security office of the change of address before the middle of the month, you should make sure that the local Post Office knows of the change so that it may hold or forward your check.

As an added precaution, even when Social Security is informed of a change of address, the Post Office also should be notified.

If you were receiving social security benefits and were under age 72 during 1964 and if you earned over \$1,200 in the year, you must report your earnings before next Thursday, April 15, 1965, to the Social Security Administration. Failure to report these earnings may result in loss of some benefits.

On the other hand, your earnings last year might increase the amount of your social security benefits. The Social Security Administration examines all annual reports of earnings to see if the amount being paid is the highest possible.

If you are entitled to receive social security benefits but are not receiving all of your checks because you are working, the annual report of earnings is needed to determine if any additional payments for 1964 should be paid to you.

If you are under 72 and plan to continue working, the Social Security Administration needs to know how much you expect to make during 1965. This will be the basis for determining the number of checks you can be paid this year.

Other events which may affect your social security payments also should be reported promptly. Some of them are: marriage of a widow or child beneficiary; improvement of a

disabled person; adoption of minor children; change of custody of children; death of a person receiving payments on your account, and other changes as explained at the time you applied for social security benefits.
