A consensus of informed opinion is that the Chinese will go only so far as is necessary to assure that the Brazzaville regime remains virulently anti-Western. That will insure Peking's main objective, which is to maintain a secure base from which to subvert Tshombe's regime in Leopoldville.

It is the "other" Congo, with its far-flung industrial complex and huge natural resources that is the real prize. And despite the year-long, Communist-supported insurrection against Leopoldville, it has been "business-as-usual" for most of the giant companies that have always prospered in the mineral-rich and fertile former Belgian colony across the river from Brazzaville.

As we have explained in previous columns, most of the other former French colonies in Africa have become disenchanted with the Chinese Communists. Brazzaville remains an exception.

Peking had hoped to put the skids under the Leopoldville regime last month when the Organization of African Unity foreign ministers met in Nairobi. Aided and abetted by their anti-Western allies in Ghana, Tanzania, Uganda, Algeria and the United Arab Republic, the Chinese thought they had Tshombe on the ropes at the Kenya conference. But Moise managed to slip and slug his way to a diplomatic victory that left his enemies virtually paralyzed
