

## Negro Leader Lauds Rights Act Statement By Alabama Groups

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. -- A statement issued by 22 major Alabama business groups urging compliance with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 has been hailed by a Negro leader as the most important step ever taken by the state's "white power structure.

The praise came from Dr. John Nixon, president of the Alabama chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

Businessmen publicized the statement in the state's 22 daily newspapers and in The Wall Street Journal in New York.

"This is the best statement ever made by any member of the white power structure," Dr. Nixon said. "This is what the Negro needs most. First-class citizens need decent jobs."

Dr. Nixon, a dentist, said it was now up to the businessmen to prove their good faith by

implementing their pronouncements.
"The Negro must be ready to take advantage of this and seek the jobs which now should be open to him," he added.

The Rev. J. E. Lowery, an associate of the

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's., said that 'on the whole the businessmen's statement was excellent." He asked, however, that the white leaders be more specific.

The advertisement was entitled "What We Believe and Where We Stand."

Among other things, the statement advocated full protection and opportunity under law for "all our citizens, both Negro and white; the right of every eligible citizen to register and cast his ballot, and obedience to the law even though some may question the wisdom of particular laws."
