Text: "But Jonah Rose Up to Flee Unto Tarshish From the Presence of the Lord, and Went Down to Joppa; and He Found a Ship Going to Tarshish; So He Paid the Fare Thereof, and Went Down Into It, to Go With Them Unto Tarshish From the Presence of the Lord." Jonah 1:3.

to ask an interview. "And so you want an interview with me because someone wrote a book about me being swallowed by a big fish and living to tell about it?'

I'll admit that the story cannot be forgotten, but I would mention it only for the purpose of finding out something more than the details of your interesting experience.

"What do you want to find out?"

I'm on a quest for REV. D. M. CLARK big ideas. I would like to know what is your big idea.

"I don't know what you mean by 'big idea." I've had several ideas in my life. Some of them weren't very big. Some of them were wrong.'

I'd be pleased to hear even about the wrong ideas.

"Like every man, I was a child of my times, and I had the idea that nobody outside Israel was of any worth or consequence. Those were days of comfort and luxury in this land. Though we weren't for God, we rested in the fact that God was for us. Our spirit was ugly and narrow and selfish. I had the same idea as my people, except for an ineffective preacher here and there. It was an idea of narrow nationalism. It was wrong."

What made you change your mind?

"When the word of the Lord came to me to go to the great city of Nineveh and cry against it because of its wickedness, I was shocked. What did I care about Nineveh? No one in Israel had any love for the people of Nineveh, nor did I. But there was no doubt about the call of the Lord to preach in Nineveh. Something was wrong. Then I did have an idea. It wasn't a big one. It was a silly one.'

What was that?

"I decided to run away from God. I would take a ship for Spain."

Instead of running away from God you began to run to God. The book says that you prayed. That was very human, Jonah, to pray to God when you were in trouble.

"Yes, I called to the Lord in my distress and He answered me. The Lord said, 'Go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you'. I was given a second chance.

That's a good idea, isn't it?--the Lord gives a man a second chance.

It's the truth. I went to Nineveh, and I prophesied the city's doom within forty days if they did not turn from their evil ways. God gave me persuasive speech. They believed God. and the people turne he king, the nobles

That's irony! I will not reply! Let it go as another of my stupidities. But I did finally arrive at the big idea, as you call it.'

What was that?

is this! .God cares! God cares for Nineven an he cares for Israel! God cares for men, and even for the beasts of the field.'

That is a big idea. I wonder if there is any greater--God knows and loves and seeks the salvation of all men.

'I learned it the hard way!" said Jonah, ending the interview.
