Rev. Bohler Speaks Here California Cleric Replaces Motley At NAACP Rally

REV. LEWIS P. BOHLER JR. of Los Angeles. a veteran of the Selma-Montgomery march, will be a special guest speaker at the Freedom Fund Banquet of the Las Vegas NAACP on Thursday, June 17, at the Las Vegas Convention Center.

The militant Southern California minister, rector of the Episcopal Church of the Advent in Los Angeles, is a replacement for Constance. Baker Motley, president of the Borough of Manhattan, who was forced to cancel her local engagement due to the pressure of her official duties in New York City.

The Rev. Bohler will share the podium at the June 17 affair with Tarea Hall Pittman of Berkeley, Calif., West Coast regional secretary the NAACP.

"We consider it particularly fortunate that the Rev. Bohler will be able to address our annual rally next month," said Frank Anderson, general chairman of the Freedom Fund Banquet committee.

The Rev. Bohler is a distinguished member of the clergy and an unstinting supporter of the civil rights movement. He not only participated in the celebrated Alabama march from Selma to Montgomery, but he made a second trip to Selma in order to lend aid and comfort to the victims of bigotry and persecution in that dark corner of our land, "Anderson said. "He undoubtedly will be able to give us a true, 'inside' account of present conditions in the Deep South."

In graciously accepting the role of substitute speaker here on June 17, the Rev. Bohler revealed that through a strange coincidence, Mrs. Motley is making a one-day round-trip from New York to Los Angeles this Sunday to act as Godmother for a child he is baptizing.
