BOSSA NOVA SPECIAL

Prize-Winning Recipe—Nassau Beach Hotel Competition Loz. Galliano

I oz. Light Rum

Va oz. Apricot Flavored Brandy

1/2 oz. White of Egg 1/4 oz. Lemon Juice
Shake well, pour into a tall glass with ice cubes
and decorate with fruit.

SCOTCH FROG COCKTAIL

Prize-Winning Recipe—United Kingdom Bartenders Guild)

I oz. Vodka ½ oz. Galliano ½ oz. Cointreau

Juice of I lime Dash of Angostura Bitters
I teospoon Maraschino Cherry Juice
Shake and strain into champagne glass.

GALLIANO MIST

Fill old-fashioned glass with cracked ice. Pour I oz. Golliano over ice and squeeze and drop ¼ section fresh lime into glass. Stir and serve.

ITALIAN STINGER COCKTAIL

I oz. Galliano
1¼ oz. Brandy
Shake well with cracked ice. Strain
into cocktail aloss.

COCKTAIL ST. VINCENT

Prize-Winning Recipe—Associazione Italiano Barmen e Sostenitorii I oz. Galtiano

I oz. Gin Few drops of Grenadine Shake with ice and serve in cocktail glass.

GOLDEN CADILLAC

l oz. White Creme de Cocoo l oz. Cream Place in blender with small quantity of crushed ice. Use low speed for short time until creamy. Pour into champagne glass.

WHITE MINK

I oz. Galliano
½ oz. Triple Sec

½ oz. Créam ½ oz. Orange Juice Shake with ice. Strain into champagne

GOLDEN DREAM COCKTAIL

Prize-Winning Recipe—United Kingdom Bartenders Guildi
I oz. Galliano

½ oz. Cointreau

1/2 oz. Orange Juice 1/2 oz. Cream Shuke in cracked ice. Strain into cocktail glass.
