from page 1) here next year. Their costs have not as yet been estimated, but it is understood that most of the required cash will come from funds already appro-priated by Congress for the War on Poverty.

Voting "aye" on all four proposals were Chairman Chester Sewell, Dr. Clare Woodbury, Dell Robison, Walter McCall and George Wilkinson.

Last week's action by the school board indicated that Wilkinson apparently has been won over to the so-called "more liberal" viewpoint on federal aid to education generally supported by the other male members of board.

At the board's regular meeting on May 27, with Sewell and McCall out of the state, Wilkinson combined with Mrs. Cannon and Mrs. Blue to temporarily sidetrack local implementation of Project Head Start, a nation-wide preschool training pro-gram especially designed to help 4-yearolds from culturally sub-standard environments start kindergarten on an equal basis with children from "better" homes. Dr. Woodbury and Robison supported the proposal at that time.

A WEEK LATER, at a special meeting of the school trustees, Sewell and McCall voted with Dr. Woodbury and Robison to revive the pre-school project and it will go

into operation by the end of the month. Some 300 young-

sters will benefit from the program, which will be financed by a \$53,131 grant from the Office of Economic Opportunity and a mostly non-cash contribution of \$9,472 (in services and facilities) from the school district.
