# from the CAPITOL

A SEARCH IS UNDERWAY for young Nevadans who distinguished themselves by acts of bravery or public service in 1964. Those considered the most outstanding will be nominated for Young American Medals for Bravery and Service, awarded annually by the Attorney General of the United States.

National awards for bravery in 1963 went to a seven-year-old girl who lost her life getting her tiny brother out of their burning house, a 13-year-old boy who twice descended into a noxious, abandoned cesspool to rescue a two-year-old child and a 16-year-old girl who ran

back into the family's burning home to protect her invalid grandmother.

An award for service was granted to an 18-year-old who organized his friends into a volunteer remedial reading school for Puerto Rican and Negro children in the Harlem section of New York City.

Thus far, two Nevada teenagers have been recommended for consideration--a Las Vegas youth who risked death in an unsuccessful attempt to save two men from a burning warehouse and a Reno teenager who has developed a program of teaching younger boys how to construct soap box racers and handle them in competition.

LLOYD R. HUNTER, 17, then a senior at Western High School in Las Vegas, and a companion went into the warehouse following an explosion in an effort to locate two trapped men. Smoke and fire drove them back after they had reached the center of the structure. Hunter

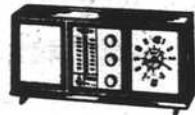
