I am sure there are many other young people throughout Nevada whose heroism and devotion to others deserve the widest recognition. It is hoped the people of this state will bring their exploits to public attention by writing the Governor's office in Carson City.

At a time when the misconduct of a small segment of our young men and women is used to indict all of them, it is appropriate that we recognize the courage and compassion that more truly characterizes our young people.

Nominees must have performed their acts of bravery or service during 1964 and prior to their 19th birthday.

NEVADA TOOK its most significant legal stride toward equality for all residents last week as the 1965 Civil Rights Act, a result of bi-partisan and bi-racial efforts, became law. The state statute is modeled substantially after the federal law of 1964, but does have some added features.

A thorough review of the law would take thousands of words, but in essence it prohibits discrimination in areas of public accommodation and in employment by employers of 15 or more employees. The Nevada Equal Rights Commission assumes broader powers and penalties and damages are provided.

Under the federal law, restaurants, lunch counters and other facilities engaged in selling food for consumption on the premises are included. Under this language, it is questionable whether the local bar and other establishments were covered. The Nevada law includes restaurants and lunch counters, but eliminates the condition that they be principally engaged in selling food on the premises and inserts casinos or any facility where spiritous or malt liquors are sold.

Shake and strain into champagne glass.

GALLIANO MIST
Fill old-fashioned glass with cracked ice. Pour 1 oz. Galliano over ice and squeeze and drop ¼ section fresh lime into glass. Stir and serve.

ITALIAN STINGER COCKTAIL
1 oz. Galliano
1 ¼ oz. Brandy
Shake well with cracked ice. Strain into cocktail glass.

COCKTAIL ST. VINCENT
(Prize-Winning Recipe—Associazione Italiana Barman e Sostenitori)
1 oz. Galliano
1 oz. Light Cream
1 oz. Gin Few drops of Grenadine
Shake with ice and serve in cocktail glass.

GOLDEN CADILLAC
1 oz. Galliano
1 oz. White Creme de Cacao
1 oz. Cream
Place in blender with small quantity of crushed ice. Use low speed for short time until creamy. Pour into champagne glass.

WHITE MINK
1 oz. Galliano
½ oz. Triple Sec
½ oz. Vodka
½ oz. Cream
½ oz. Orange Juice
Shake with ice. Strain into champagne glass.

GOLDEN DREAM COCKTAIL
(Prize-Winning Recipe—United Kingdom Bartenders Guild)
1 oz. Galliano
½ oz. Cointreau
½ oz. Orange Juice ½ oz. Cream
Shake in cracked ice. Strain into cocktail glass.
