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Text: But It Is Good for Me to Draw Near to God: I Have Put My Trust in the Lord God That I May Declare All Thy Works. Psalms 73:28.

Why bother about God? Nobody has ever seen Him. No two people ever agree about what He is like. And so many lives in which God apparently has played a large part have been narrow, restricted, cramped; at least to the outsider. They have been filled with a gnawing

sense of guilt and deprived of all real pleasure in the satisfaction of life's most basic desires. God has "caused" so many heartbreaks in so many lives, and so many battles have been fought in His name, why not leave Him alone? It is all so vague and so much in the realm of mystery, why bother about it? Why get involved in something so fantastically remote and yet, at the same time, so often disturbing? REV. D. M. CLARK



There are so many other things that we can work on here and now in which we can see the results of what we do. Why bother about God, especially since we are getting along so well? We are happy, we have a wonderful home life, we have plenty to eat and a nice place to live, and wonderful schools. Why take on something that would raise so many questions, impose so many additional obligations, create so many unpleasant things to do? Why take on that extra burden?

There are many sincere human beings who are in this quandary.

Without God there is no one to needle you. from above, there is no one to nag you from on high; to make you feel that you should have done something that you didn't do, or to make you feel like a worm because you did do something that you shouldn't have done.

The assumption behind this whole point of view is that the only things that you bother about in life are the things that make life possible, or pleasant. As a matter of fact, when you stop to think about it, the things that people have bothered most about are the things that are neither necessary nor pleasant.

The thing that makes a man a man is his desire to bother about things that are of no earthly benefit to him whatsoever.

If you have decided--I don't say that you have, but you may have--if you have decided to bother only about the things that make life possible and pleasant, to do only the things that give you immediate pleasure and physical satis-faction, you need to be "shook up" before you get settled in a rut that can be deeper than any open grave. For when a man is willing to settle for a life that requires little more than an animal existence, you can be sure that he is on his way to becoming little more than an animal himself.

We have been asking this question--why bother about God?--as though it were phrased-why should a PERSON bother about God? Perhaps we should put it this way: Why do people bother about God? There are at least two reasons.
