Wash and cap strawberries. Sprinkle with sugar and mint flakes and mix gently. Add orange juice and mix gently again. Chill until ready to serve. Garnish with whipped cream or dessert topping, if wished. Makes 4 to 6

Self-Helpers Open **New Economy Shop** n Owens Saturday

OPERATION INDEPENDENCE will open its new and unique Economy Shop at 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 31, at 813 Owens Ave. (opposite the Golden West Shopping Center), under the supervision of Margot Miller.

In announcing the West Las Vegas community improvement agency's latest project, Director Lubertha Johnson said the new variety store eventually will feature low-priced items made or refurbished by local residents in conformity with Operation Independence's "self-help" ob-

These items will be accepted by the Economy. Shop from their owners on a consignment basis, with Operation Independence receiving a small percentage of the sale price as a handling fee.

At the outset, however, items offered for sale will consist largely of donated articles of clothing for men, women and children. The stock will be expanded during the coming weeks to include new and used household goods and toys. Necessary repairs of used articles will be done by persons connected with the Operation Independence program.

Mrs. Johnson said local residents also are invited to display their arts and crafts work in the shop for possible sale at a small handling

charge. Miss Miller and members of the Neighborhood Youth Corps have been working at the shop since last Monday in preparation for Saturday's opening. All profits realized by the project will go toward the 10 per cent local contribution required by law for federal grants to various welfare projects administered by Operation Independence.

barriers and restrictions. He was concerned, also, that beset and deprived as he was, the Negro citizen must muster from the hidden wells that give life and majesty to the world's men, those qualities and procedures which would speed the freedom of both the nation and the minority.

Others brought bluntness or momentary pragmatism or suavity or deftness or warmth to this great human problem of the races in America. Adlai Stevenson brought to it a clear and comprehensive concept, a firm conviction born of his moral precepts and an action based upon his love of freedom and his passionate affection for his country.

On a thousand occasions since 1952, whether denouncing apartheid, conferring on high policy, or offering gracious comment at a United Nations function, Adlai Stevenson served the human race, beckoning it, in his time and through his magnificent gifts, to a higher plateau, to, as he put it, "a vision of things that are to
