Prior to his new assignment, Mr. Fitzgerald served as the first (and until last month, the only) principal of Kit Carson School here in West Las Vegas. Before taking over at Kit Carson nine years ago, he was an art and shop instructor in adult education and was associated with the apprentice program of Carpenters Local 1780 here.

Mr. Fitzgerald earned his B.S. degree in art education at Virginia State College and a Master's degree in education at the University

of Nevada in Reno. His career as an educator was temporarily interrupted by a hitch in the U.S. armed services, which resulted in the bestowal of a Bronze Star for meritorious service in the South Pacific.

As an educator, Mr. Fitzgerald has chalked up several no-

H. P. FITZGERALD chalked up several notable "firsts" for members of the Negro race in Nevada. He not only was the first colored person to be awarded a Master's degree by the University of Nevada, but he was the first Negro to be appointed a school principal in this state and the first to be certified to teach vocational and adult education. He also was the first of his race to be awarded a general contractor's license in Nevada.

In paying tribute to Mr. Fitzgerald, we should not overlook the accomplishments of Mrs. James (Helen) Anderson, who has succeeded him as principal at Kit Carson. In assuming her new duties, Mrs. Anderson became the first colored woman to serve in such an administrative post in Nevada.

We salute both Mr. Fitzgerald and Mrs. Anderson.
