IT IS TIME for a few plain words on the outbursts against authority that are sweeping America today, the embarrassing spectacle of young people abrogating their obligations as citizens -- often at the urging of equally misguided older persons.

There is much room for disagreement on Viet Nam and other matters, and there are many ways to express it. There is no rational basis, however, for attempting to circumvent the orderly processes of government, or for substituting civil chaos for responsible debate. There is ample opportunity for dissent, for protest, and for non-conformity. But they must be carried out within the legal framework of our society.

The young people of America, as never before, have assumed a powerful role in creating a greater, more humane, nation. It has been inspiring to watch those students who in recent times have protested injustice--and who by the logic and strength of their protests have persuaded most of the country that injustice does exist. They have received respectful attention.

The behavior of many young Americans in recent weeks is not deserving of such respect, however.

All sane men oppose war, inequality and injustice. But they must act creatively and effectively within our long-established system to overcome these evils. The action they take must be based on both common sense and courage.

We live in an era of ferment, of challenge and change--and anguish. This is an age of awareness, of realizing that we not only can help fulfill the promises that have been broken in the past, but also help shape a better climate for tomorrow. There is a restlessness and a questioning, and this is good.

The youth of America want to be "where the action is." For this is not a beat or silent generation. This generation is alive with energy and idealism. We have watched proudly as students have taken part in legitimate protests against inequity.

But when laws are openly defied, when a small segment of society challenges the system designed by whole of society, then we are in danger. This is when acts of protest and dissent become destructive; the beginning of a time when law and order give way to anarchy and chaos.

I am proud that Nevada has not been defiled by such demonstrations. I believe our young people are in accord with the majority of their fellows in this country--proud of their heritage and determined to protect it.
