--one "at large"; five from the Las Vegas, Moapa Valley, Paradise Valley and Virgin Valley areas; one from Henderson and Boulder City, and one from North Las Vegas.

Assemblymatic representatives will be comprised of two Assemblymen from North Las Vegas; two from Henderson; one Assemblyman representing Mesquite, Moapa, and Bunkerville; 9 from Las Vegas and Paradise Valley and two "at large" for Las Vegas, North Las Vegas and Paradise Valley.
