



CAP Programs Formed

THE WAR ON POVERTY is off to a good start here in Northern Nevada. The Program Development Project, now being conducted by the Washoe County Community Action Association, was formed to implement Community Action Programs through the Office of Economic Opportunity as provided by Title II of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964.

The underlying purpose of community action protrams is to help urban and rural communities to mobilize their resources to combat economic and social deficiencies.

Federal assistance is available up to a maximum of 90% to cover costs of developing, conducting and administering the community action program, with the remaining 10% contributed by the community being served. The 10% non-federal share need not be in cash, but can be "in kind", which can be use of local services or property, research assistance, office space, etc., where-in no reimbursement is required.

Remedial reading, literacy courses, employment counseling, homemaker services, job development and training, consumer education, vocational rehabilitation and health services are some of the activities that can be supported and coordinated within a community action program.




