BE JOYOUS!

DAY AFTER CHRISTMAS. . . and a day of rest.

Wouldn't it be ideal if we could always arrange the calendar to be so obliging. It's not a n 'nute too soon to think about New Years--the parade, the game, and of course, those New Years Eve parties.

One way to greet guests, who come to help welcome the New Year, without that stuffed feeling is to offer them these satisfying holiday dips.

Chips and crackers, carrot strips, tiny cherry tomatoes, cauliflower clusters, celery and cucumbers are delicious "dippers".

Creamy Horseradish Ham Dip

1/2 cup heavy cream whipped

l packet horseradish dip or seasoning mix l can (2-1/4 oz) deviled Ham

Blend ingredients together thoroughly and refrigerate about one hour before serving. *Green Onion Dip*

1 cup dairy sour cream

2 packets green onion dip or seasoning mix Combine sour cream and green onion. Refrigerate one hour before serving. Serve with potato chips, corn chips, cooked cold shrimp, green pepper wedges or your favorite vegetable cut into bite-size pieces and serve on a platter.

Liverwurst Pate 1 pound liverwurst

l packet green onion dip or seasoning mix

1 teaspoon sugar

2 teaspoons water

*Cream cheese topping

Mash liverwurst with fork. Mix onion dip, sugar and water--blend thoroughly. Chill while making cream cheese topping. Spread cream cheese over liverwurst and serve with melba toast or crackers.

*Cream cheese topping: Melt 1 tablespoon garlic spread. Whip one package (8 oz) cream cheese with 1 tablespoon milk--dash of tabasco. Blend in melted garlic spread.

Savory Tuna Dip

1 can (6-1/2 oz) chunk style Tuna drained

1 teaspoon seasoned salt.

1 tablespoon grated onion

l cup dairy sour cream Place tuna in mixing bowl and flake with fork. Add seasoned salt and onion. Combine thoroughly and fold in sour cream. Sprinkle with chopped parseley before serving with potato chips or crackers.

MOST OF US usually have chitterlings during holidays. This is my favorite bar dinner:

Cut left-over chitterling in bite size (free of grease.) Make thick batter of flour, buttermilk and garlic salt. Dip chitterling into batter. Fry in deep fat--Serve hot and you truly will enjoy the New Years games or Rosebowl tournament.
