His place of work will be the Nuclear Rocket Development Station, 90 miles northwest of Las Vegas.

In this position, Mr. Johnson will receive at least one year on-the-job training in the Atomic Energy Commission's program to develop a staff of talented young executives with an educational background in Liberal Arts and Public and Business Administration.

Johnson joined the AEC's Management Intern Program in August of 1965 after studying at the University of Pittsburgh's (Pennsylvania) Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. He is a graduate of Morehouse College, Atlanta, Georgia, and attended the University of Pittsburgh on a Ford Foundation, Foreign Affairs Scholars, Fellowship Grant.
