WASHINGTON--Senator Alan Bible of Nevada is among three United States Senators named by Vice President Hubert Humphrey to the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Naval Academy, it was announced today.

The Board meets annually at Annapolis to inquire into the state of morale and discipline, the curriculum, instruction, physical equipment, fiscal affairs, academic methods, and related matters. Its reports and recommendations are submitted to the President.

Bible has served several times on academy boards of visitors.

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NY Police Commissioner Under Attack For Views On John Birch Society

According to a recent Associated Press release, newly installed Police Commissioner Howard R. Leary says he plans to permit policemen to join the right-wing John Birch Society, provided membership does not "impair their efficiency."

Leary, former Philadelphia police head, took this position Tuesday in response to questions by newsmen in his first policy declaration since he was sworn in Monday for a five-year term.

It drew praise from a Birch Society spokesman but was attacked by the Antidefamation League of B'nai B'rith, a Jewish service organization.

Leary said he would follow the same practice in the matter as he did in Philadelphia.

"If those persons desirous of membership in the John Birch Society are not taking a position contrary to the policies and practices of the New York Police Department or to the federal or state constitutions and the city charter, we find no fault with that," he said.

The society's national director of public relations, John H. Rousset, was quoted by the New York Times as terming Leary's declaration "a fine policy" in a telephone interview from San Marino, Calif.

However, a spokesman for B'nai B'rith said that "a police officer who subscribes to the ideas of the John Birch Society cannot in our view perform his work without prejudices."

"For instance," he said, "the John Birch Society believes that the civil rights movement is Communist-controlled and that democracy is a sham and a fraud."

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
