

ABOUT BOATS

Boats must be registered to comply with both Federal and State Laws. Anyone who operates a motorboat must display registration numbers (to comply with Coast Guard regulations) and immediately aft of these numbers, a current registration sticker must be displayed (to comply with State and local laws).

The County Assessor's office handles all

The County Assessor's office handles all registrations for motorboats. Persons applying for boat registration must have paid the annual Poll Tax fee of \$3, which is also payable at the Assessor's office in the County Building at

Second and Carson.

THE COAST GUARD NUMBERS ARE NOT changed from year to year. The original identification numbering system remains the same as long as the boat stays in the possession of its owner. The owner does not reapply for new numbers unless the boat is moved into another state and remains there for more than 90 days. In such cases, the owner must apply for registration in the other state. This is a federal requirement. Each state has letters which precede the boat registration numbers. These letters identify the home state of the boat. The letters NV identify Nevada, AZ identifies Arizona, and CF denotes California as the State of reg-

The identification numbers must be properly fixed on each side of the boat near its bow. The numbers must be at least 3 inches, measured from top to bottom, and must be in BOLD color contrasters the boat's color. The color of these letters and numbers is usually black since boats are almost never painted black. The Nevada Fish and Game Commission is the official state department charged with the responsibility of boat identification in Nevada. The Clark County Assessor is the official to whom the Fish and Game Commission delegates the authority of boat registration.

THE ASSESSOR is also charged with the responsibility of collecting Personal Property Taxes on boats. The decal sticker which is affixed to each side of the boat immediately aft of the numbers indicates that the boat is currently registered. The color of the sticker is a different color each year. The color makes identification a simple matter.

When the annual decal sticker is sold to the owner, the Assessor charges and collects the proper Personal Property Taxes which are based upon the value of the boat. The tax rate is limited by law to \$5 per hundred dollars of value. The value is determined by a Blue Book similar to the one used by Used Car Dealers.

Boat Trailers are not licensed by the Assessor. The Nevada Motor Vehicle Department licenses Boat Trailers. The licensing of Trailers is handled quite the same as automobile and truck licensing. However, when a boat trailer is licensed for the first time, the owner must present a certificate of weight along with proper ownership identification.

WHEN REGISTERING a new boat and trailer, the owner should request the dealer to furnish a certificate of weight for the trailer. A new trailer cannot be registered (Motor Vehicle Dep't. on East Sahara) without this certificate.
