

### Gallagher Files Today

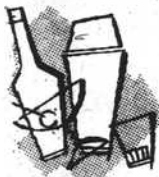
MERVIN J. GALLAGHER today for re-election to the office of State Inspector of Mines on the Democratic ticket. Appropriately enough Mr. Gallagher paid his filing fee with One Hundred silver dollars.

Gallagher, 54, was first elected State Inspector of Mines in 1950 and Nevada voters have returned him to this office in each State election since that time.

Born and reared in Virginia City, Nevada, Gallagher graduated from the local schools there and attended St. Ignatius College in San Francisco for two years. He then returned to the Comstock to engage in mining. Appointed a Deputy State Mine Inspector in 1942, he served in that capacity for four years. In 1946, and again in 1948, he was elected by the people of Storey County to represent them in the Assembly of the State Legislature. Mr. Gallagher is married to the former Clarisse Young of Virginia City and they are the parents of three daughters.

In announcing his candidacy in a letter to Mr. Warren L. Monroe, Chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee, Mr. Gallagher stated "If elected, I assure you I shall continue to vigorously direct my efforts toward an efficient administration of the duties and functions of the office of Inspector of Mines and for the best interests of the people of the State of Nevada. I shall as always, endeavor to further the mining industry in the State and to aid Nevada prospectors in every possible way."

Scranton; William Robinson, former Illinois state representative; Clarence Townes, Richmond, executive assistant, Virginia Republican state committee; and Q. V. Williamson, Atlanta city councilman.

Walker, director, Ohio Department of Industrial Relations and publisher, Cleveland Call-Post.
