WASHINGTON, D.C .-- The President has announced the formation of a Council to the White House Conference, "To Fulfill These Rights." The Council, composed of a cross section of the nation's leadership, will devote evenings and weekends to preparation for the Conference first proposed by the President in his speech at Howard University in June, 1965. The Conference will be held in Washington, June 1 and 2.

A. Philip Randolph is Honorary Chairman of the Conference. The newly formed Council will be chaired by Ben W. Heineman, Chairman of the Board of Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Co. Edward C. Sylvester, Jr., Director of the Labor Department's Office of Federal Contract Compliance; and Rev. Walter E. Fauntroy, Director of the Washington Bureau of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, are Vice Chairmen of the Council and will assist Mr. Heineman.

The President charged the Council, under the Chairmanship of Ben W. Heineman, with the responsibility of sifting the concepts, proposals, and programs outlined in the 1965 Planning Session and developing through their experience and knowledge a substantive agenda. It will be the task of the Council to consult with experts across the country; then develop programs for change to be presented to the Conference participants for their consideration and action. The Council met March 5 for its first meeting.

In his speech at Howard University, the President announced he would call the Conference "to help the American Negro fulfill the rights which, after the long time of injustice, he is finally about to secure.

The Planning Session, held November 17 and 18, brought together approximately 250 scholars, leaders, and experts in civil rights problems from across the nation to consider some of the outstanding problems involved in bringing minority groups in this country from opportunity to achievement.
