**Publication Day Program Tonight**

Approximately 300 junior-senior high school students, faculty sponsors, school administrators and guests will participate in the Clark County School District's second annual "Publications Day" tonight (Thursday) in the Convention Center Gold Room and adjacent conference rooms.

The event, designed to stimulate journalism and yearbook students to produce high caliber school publications, is divided into three portions: introductory session, professional clinics and luncheon-awards section.

All three portions involve professionals in the field of mass communications. This year's keynote speaker will be H. M. (Hank) Greenspun, Editor-Publisher of the Las Vegas Sun, who will talk on "The Newspaper--Its Responsibility to Youth of the Community."

Discussion leaders for the professional clinics (newspaper section) include Mrs. Delores Spencer, Women's Editor, Las Vegas Review-Journal; Johnny Parker, KORK Radio and TV announcer; Bryn Armstrong, Executive Editor, Las Vegas Sun; Mrs. Joy Harman, public relations counselor; Sister Irmalyn, Bishop Gorman, and Vice President of the co-sponsoring Clark County Secondary Schools Student Newspaper and Yearbook Advisers Association; Ed Kelly, co-owner, Kelly and Reber Agency; Robert Campbell, owner, Allied Printing Company.

The yearbook section clinics will feature Will Loe, American Yearbook Company; Robert Wilcox Studio, Phoenix, Ariz.; Larry Marsh, Southwest Yearbook Company; and Kenner Kartchner, Taylor Publishing Company.

Las Vegas Professional Chapter, Sigma Delta Chi, will furnish career speakers for the luncheon-awards program including Hank Thornley, News Director, KLAS-TV; James Deitch, Manager, Las Vegas News Bureau, and Robert Brown, partner, Kelly and Reber.

Among the most important awards to be presented will be Sigma Delta Chi's "General Journalistic Excellence" to Las Vegas High School "Desert Breeze"; the Review-Journal's "Outstanding Staffer Award" plaques by Associate Editor Colin McKinlay, and the "Sweepstakes Trophy" based on excellence in four individual competitions to be held during the morning and donated by the Thunderbird Hotel on a revolving basis.

Guest judges for the individual competition are Myram Borders of United Press International and Rick Meyer of The Associated Press. School District Publications Coordinator Ross Tucker is serving as general chairman of the event; George Appleton, journalism instructor at Boulder City High School and Advisers Association President, will introduce the keynote speaker.

**NSU Summer Session Schedule**

DR. HERBERT A. DERFELT, director of Nevada Southern University Summer Session, today announced that class schedules for the enlarged summer program are now available to the general public. Schedules may be obtained by phoning the University 736-6111, extension 220, or by written request.

Summer Session dates are June 9-July 22 (6 weeks) and July 25-August 19 (4 weeks). Within each session short courses are being offered for credit. Educational workshops are being planned in School Administration, Elementary and Secondary Education, and Physical Education.

Registration for the first Session is June 8, 8-11 a.m., 1-3:30 p.m., 6:30-8:30 p.m. Registration for the second Session is July 21, 1-3:30 p.m., and July 22, 9-11 a.m.

An European tour from June 9 to July 15 carrying six possible credits is a feature of Summer Session. Dr. Irwin H.
